hope everyone had a good break over the festive season with most areas receiving some rain with a broader rain event in the first week of January.

The crop has had a magnificent start, 3 but is in need of some moisture now to keep it powering along.

December saw most of us really chaotic with fertilising and spraying to be done with a crop racing to out of hand. Groundwater allocations have been 5 reassessed and some good increases were announced.

The rain in November interfered with soybean plans with the window for A6785 closing before growers could get them planted, in saying that there has been some Kuranda and Hayman planted due to their later planting window.

1 February sees nominations for board positions open, I urge you to consider nominating for a position to help steer our industry into the future, if anyone has any questions please feel free to call any of the current Directors.

On a bright note, sugar prices have risen with the 2021 Season likely to reach \$560/tonne with the increase in water allocations and possibility of locking in some forward pricing the outlook is a lot brighter than it has been for some time.

On page 3 you will find information on a proposal from Bundaberg Sugar for a cane railway bridge. We strongly support this initiative as it will get a lot of trucks off the road and potentially open up options for some cane expansion and will be a good outcome for growers and the general community. This project should be supported financially by the State and Federal governments and we will advocate if required.

Here is hoping for some more rain and kind weather.

## 2022 CANEGROWERS' Elections

he timetable has been set for the ▲ 2022 CANEGROWERS Election process. Held every three (3) years, the elections are an opportunity for all members to elect Directors to sit on the board of their local CANEGROWERS district.

Bundaberg has five (5) Directors that sit on the Board and nominations for the positions open on 1 February 2022. Both men and women of all ages are encouraged to nominate as candidates for these important CANEGROWERS elected positions.

The local boards then nominate representatives to sit on the CANEGROWERS Queensland Policy Council which elects the new CANEGROWERS Queensland Board.

Members wishing to nominate for a district board position have until 5pm on 25 February 2022 to act. The election process will be finalised by 20 April 2022 and the new directors will commence official duties on 1 May 2022.

Nomination packs are available for collection from reception from 1 February 2022. Nominations must be in writing and signed by the nominee plus at least six (6) members.

CANEGROWERS Queensland will conduct an election if required.

# Harvesting group arrangements

The Collective Contract stipulates the following arrangements for grouping:

#### 8. Grouping

8.1 Formation.— The Mill Owner shall provide an indication of the likely modes of crush for the coming Season in writing to Bundaberg CANEGROWERS Ltd by the 14 April. Applications by a grower to join a harvesting group must be received by the Mill Owner by the 21 April of each year and the Mill Owner must advise

the grower's new Delivery Point to ensure the efficient and economic operation of the Mill transport system.

Growers who have been advised of a new Delivery Point shall notify the Mill Owner by the 15 May if they will accept the new Delivery Point. In the absence of any Application to the Mill Owner from a grower prior to 21 April, and any notification of acceptance of a Delivery Point by a grower to the Mill Owner prior to the 15 May for those growers advised of a new Delivery Point, the grower's membership of their harvesting group shall be deemed to be the same as the previous season.

In order to avoid some of the issues that arose last year I suggest you sort out your harvesting needs sooner than the 21 April deadline.

#### **Rates**

## Cane Rail Bridge

Bundaberg Sugar Ltd (BSL) has made a request to Council to designate premises for development of infrastructure comprising a cane rail bridge, approach trestles and cane rail line.

On the west side of the Burnett River, the new rail line will extend from existing BSL cane rail infrastructure at Lot 5 RP41027 on River Road through BSL land (with a level crossing at Gahans Road and Fairymead Access Road) before transitioning on BSL land to trestles as it approaches the Burnett River.

The bridge itself crosses the river from

a point just north of River Road to Strathdees Road on the eastern bank.

On the east side of the river, the bridge will connect to trestles situated in the northern verge of Strathdees Road road reserve before the rail line loops at grade across Strathdees Road to connect with existing BSL cane rail infrastructure in the vicinity of Barrons Road road reserve.

The bridge incorporates a 25 metre wide retractable opening span which will remain in the open position outside of the cane crushing season. During the cane crushing season, the opening span is operated by telemetry



from the Millaquin Mill Traffic Control Office. This Office is manned on a 24/7 basis during the crush. A vessel whose height above waterline necessitates the opening of the bridge (ie above 3.5m at HAT or above 7.1m at LAT) can either pre-book an opening or telephone the Traffic Control Office to request the bridge be opened.

## **Extreme Weather Events and Safety**

#### How prepared are you?

Staying safe during a severe weather event is something which affects all of us – both personally and when working with others.

While we may all face a different hand from Mother Nature's playbook – be that severe storms, bushfires or cyclones – one thing remains the same: how prepared are we?

#### Prepare for any event

#### **Bush Fires**

During a bushfire, your safety depends on your preparations and the decisions you make. Make your bushfire survival plan now and know exactly what you can do to protect yourself, your family, and your property.

#### **Cyclones**

#### **Understand vour risk**

Queensland homes within 50 kilometres of the coastline north from Bundaberg need to be strong enough to withstand cyclonic winds. In addition, homes located within 100 to 200 metres of an open shoreline are at risk of impacts from breaking waves caused by storm tide.

To understand your storm tide risk, you can request a <u>Coastal Hazard Property Map</u> which shows the estimated storm tide levels for your particular property. You can also talk to a coastal engineer who can confirm whether your property is likely to be impacted by waves during a storm tide.

#### Damage and impact

As a cyclone approaches, the wind and rain gradually increases over several hours. Winds caused by cyclones are powerful enough to break large trees, roll over sea containers, and blow away unsecured caravans, garden sheds and poorly constructed roofed patios. Strong winds associated with cyclones can cause extensive property damage and turn loose items into windborne debris that cause further building damage. Slow moving cyclones can take many hours to move past a particular location, causing extreme wind and rain that can last up to 12 hours.

## **Disaster Assistance Grants up to \$50,000**

Pollowing the November and the January rain events there have been two (2) disaster declarations for the Bundaberg Regional Council area where growers are able to apply for Disaster Assistance grants with assistance up to \$50,000. While growers are able to apply for both grants if they suffered losses and damage in both events, proof of the damage from both events will be required.

The best form of evidence is photos showing the damage however other forms of evidence are accepted. The evidence shown in the photos should be of the damage which includes erosion to the paddocks and headlands, damage to fences, water levels in pump sheds over the equipment damaged and photos of water in the paddocks. There is other information required such as rates notices, copies of bank statements and financial records to prove growers are a primary producer under the QRIDA definition and make payments of the grants easier.

Eligible items or activities under the grant program include fencing, reconditioning or repairing essential plant and equipment, repairing and restoring fields (laser leveling and ameliorants) and purchasing or hiring equipment to help in the clean up to immediately resume the business. ## **Ergon Drought Relief**

With the good summer season so far and the various changes to tariffs that have occurred over the last couple of years it is potentially a timely exercise to review your electricity tariff selection in readiness for when the drought declaration is potentially lifted.

For those growers who signed up for Ergon Energy drought relief back in 2019 and selected to revert back to their previous tariff, this review will be

essential as the irrigation tariffs that many were on at that time such as T62 and T65 have since been removed. Due to these changes, Ergon Energy Retail has advised that when the drought declaration is revoked, the drought waiver will be removed, and the tariff left as is. This has the potential for some unfortunate bill shock if tariffs are left on T66A and unexpectedly incur the fixed capacity charge, especially for larger motors.

A comprehensive tariff review can be undertaken on your electricity accounts which will provide the most suitable tariff for your usage ahead of the drought revocation and in preparedness for a tariff change when required.


