CAPABILITY STATEMENT

ORGANISATIONAL OBJECTIVES

The underpinning philosophy behind the formation of Bundaberg Sugar Services Limited was the acknowledgement by Bundaberg Sugar and CANEGROWERS of the joint responsibility for ensuring the Bundaberg sugar industry's sustainability and the need to work together and to work smarter.

The objectives of Bundaberg Sugar Services Limited are:

- to enhance the productivity of the sugar industry by increasing the quantity and improving the quality of cane produced by crops grown in the Bundaberg district;
- to achieve regional sustainability in the Bundaberg area through full utilisation of sugar industry capital;
- to provide suitable advice and help to members about:
 - the prevention, control and eradication of pest infestation and disease of cane or any other matter or thing that adversely affects the quantity or quality of crops of cane; and/or
 - the production and harvesting of cane;
- to help, and cooperate with, other bodies involved in preventing, controlling and eradicating pests in cane;
- to help, and cooperate with, other bodies involved in researching the production, harvesting, transport and processing of cane;
- to provide advice and information to members for the preservation and enhancement of the capacity of land to sustain crops of cane;
- to help minimise any damage to the environment that may be caused by activities of the sugar industry within our area.

ORGANISATIONAL SKILLS

Bundaberg Sugar Services Limited is a Public Company Limited by Guarantee, and is a not-for-profit Organisation whose funding is provided by a levy on grower members. Bundaberg Sugar Services Limited is controlled by a board of directors, two (2) of which are appointed by growers and two (2) appointed by the mill.

Bundaberg Sugar Services Limited has previously managed funding projects for Department of Agriculture, Fisheries and Forestry, Department of Employment & Training, Qld Department of Primary Industries, The Department of Natural Resources and Mines, Department of State Development, Burnett Mary Regional Group and Sugar Research and Development Corporation.

Bundaberg Sugar Services Limited has experience in managing community based projects and has the necessary personnel, systems and procedures to provide the essential level of corporate governance, management, supervision and administration to direct projects.

Bundaberg Sugar Services Limited also provides direct and extension services such as:

- Approved seed cane for planting;
- Excellent, readily accessible advice;
- Help to identify and control cane pests and diseases;

ANNUAL REPORT 2023/24

We present the report for the financial year 2023/24.

During the past twelve (12) months we have focused on needs based and member focused programs which consist of the approved plants scheme, plant source inspections, approved seed distribution pest and disease management and general extension.

On 2 January 2024 Michael Turner achieved 50 years of service to the Bundaberg Sugar industry and we acknowledge this very significant milestone.

In his 50 years working with Bundaberg Sugar Services Limited and its predecessors Michael has made a significant contribution.

He has assisted with the eradication of Fiji Disease, establishment of the 'kilogram cane' plots, building industry resilience following the detection of orange rust, smut and more recently Yellow Canopy Syndrome (YCS), as well as the continued monitoring of soldier fly, canegrubs, pink earth pearl, RSD and other pests and diseases that affect the industry.

More recently, Michael has been instrumental in establishing the germination and nursery facilities and protocols to ensure growers can access disease-free planting material and new varieties through the introduction of one-eye sett seedlings. Michael will be taking his long service leave before finishing in July 2025 and on behalf of our members, we would like to acknowledge the service, assistance and dedication that Michael Turner provides to Bundaberg Sugar Services Limited.

We have been able to recruit David Dowson to take on the more critical Core Programs and he has been a very keen understudy to Michael since 8 January 2024.

We would also like to acknowledge the service that Dale Holliss has provided Bundaberg Sugar Services Limited in the role of Company Secretary since the formation of Bundaberg Sugar Services in June 2004. Dale will be resigning from this role after the AGM and will be replaced by Tanya Howard.







CORE PROGRAMS

APPROVED SEED PRODUCTION AND DISTRIBUTION

The approved Seed Production and Distribution program ensures that all Bundaberg Sugar Services Limited plots are sampled for RSD, planted with the selected varieties and routinely inspected. As a service to members inspection of plant sources on individual farms is carried out upon request. The approved seed production is our core business and it is critical that we maintain and where possible, modernise how this service is delivered.

Approved Plants Scheme

The usual preparations for plants distribution including, organising, mailing out grower order forms, confirmation of orders, casual labour requirements, plot inspections and RSD testing of the plots were conducted. DNA samples were also taken on the varieties planted in the mother plot.

Three (3) general disease inspections were conducted at regular intervals during the year. No disease issues were detected during these inspections. There were some SRA20[@] stools found mixed with the SRA29[@] which could have happened during planting of the plot. The Mother plot was chipped on a regular basis for weeds.

Plant Source Inspections

Thirty-one (31) growers including Bundaberg Sugar requested plant source inspections and RSD tests on fifty (50) blocks of plant sources. Two (2) sources were identified with light smut infection. Four (4) blocks returned a positive result of RSD. All growers were sent notification letters outlining the RSD results.

Plot Planting

Mother plot

Spring 2023

The spring 2023 plot was planted on the 26 September. Varieties planted consist of Q138, Q183, Q208^{ϕ}, Q232^{ϕ}, Q238^{ϕ}, Q240^{ϕ}, Q242^{ϕ}, Q245^{ϕ}, Q247^{ϕ}, Q252^{ϕ}, KQ228^{ϕ}, SRA2^{ϕ}, SRA4^{ϕ}, SRA11^{ϕ}, SRA19^{ϕ}, SRA20^{ϕ}, SRA29^{ϕ}, SRAW33^{ϕ}, SRA34^{ϕ}, SRA38^{ϕ}, Q124, Q151 and Q188.

Autumn 2024

The autumn 2024 plot was planted on 5 April. Varieties planted consist of Q138, Q183, Q208 $^{\circ}$, Q232 $^{\circ}$, Q238 $^{\circ}$, Q240 $^{\circ}$, Q242 $^{\circ}$, Q245 $^{\circ}$, Q247 $^{\circ}$, Q252 $^{\circ}$, KQ228 $^{\circ}$, SRA2 $^{\circ}$, SRA4 $^{\circ}$, SRA11 $^{\circ}$, SRA19 $^{\circ}$, SRA20 $^{\circ}$, SRA29 $^{\circ}$, SRA33 $^{\circ}$, SRA34 $^{\circ}$, SRA34 $^{\circ}$, SRA38 $^{\circ}$ and Q151.

All the planting sources for mother plot are derived from tissue culture to maintain integrity of the variety.

Approved Seed Distribution


One-eye setts

Bundaberg Sugar Services one-eye setts propagation program is the main source of purchasing approved seed cane by growers. Since the inception of one-eye setts (2019) there has been a marked increase in the number of seedlings purchased by growers each year to the point where we have outgrown the previous facility.

Some growers are ordering enough seedlings to plant up to one hectare of approved seed cane.

Spring 2023

The distribution of spring 2023 seedlings commenced on 16 August. Thirty-two growers (32) growers collected 55,391 seedlings. There were no orders from Bundaberg Sugar company farms.

Autumn 2024

Autumn 2024 distribution of seedlings commenced on 18 March. Twenty-six (26) growers including Bundaberg Sugar company farms collected 37,472 seedlings.

PEST AND DISEASE MANAGEMENT

Pest and disease management remains a vital function of Bundaberg Sugar Services Limited who carry out farm inspection and interpretation of specific pest or disease incidence at the request of grower members.

One of our objectives is to provide suitable advice and help to the members about the prevention, control and eradication of pest infection and disease of cane or any other matter or thing that adversely affects the quantity and quality of crops of cane and/or the production and harvesting of cane.

Yellow Canopy Syndrome (YCS)

The 2023/24 season observations identified that there was some YCS present throughout the Bundaberg district, but not to the same extent as previous years. Some of these blocks identified were in previous year observations.

Ratoon Stunting Disease

Ratoon Stunting Disease (RSD) still remains a major disease facing the Bundaberg district. With this in mind Bundaberg Sugar Services Ltd conducts annual surveys and promotes the regular use of recommended hygiene measures to manage this disease.

Bundaberg Sugar Services conducts annual surveys across the district to identify the extent of this disease and promote the regular use of recommended hygiene measures to manage this disease.

RSD testing of the mother plot at Clayton road was conducted with twenty-four (24) samples collected using the new method of bulking stalks from a block or individual variety and sending the sample to SRA Brisbane for analysis. Samples are collected every ten (10) metres in the mother plot. All samples returned a negative result.

Machinery Inspections

There were no requests for machinery inspections in the last twelve (12) months. Any inspections requested are directed to the relevant authorised person at the Biosecurity office (DAFF) Bundaberg.

Planting, Pest and Disease data collection

Due to other work commitments a small number of grower members were surveyed including Bundaberg Sugar farms across the Bundaberg mill area.

Information collected includes where approved seed cane was planted, row spacing's, GPS planted or block just marked out by GPS, break crop rotation (soybean, peanut, smallcrops), pest or disease problems (e.g. cane grubs area affected, tonnes loss) irrigation type, fertiliser/insecticide use.

This information gives us an idea of what is going on around the district and where we need to tackle a pest, disease or nutrient situation.

During the past twelve (12) months a number of growers have taken advantage of the service provided by BSSL. Twenty-nine (29) blocks from seventeen (17) growers were sampled to determine the current nutrient status and requirements for plant and ratoon crops.

Growers are provided with a nutrient management plant and N & P budget when receiving the results.



During the 2023/24 year there were 72 soil tests for 39 growers.
